- 4. Government should make provision to provide all those who seek higher education; it should be
- 5. It is unanimously agreed upon that there is a urgent need to ensure quality education at all level especially at tertiary level.
- 6. Higher education must be linked to employment.
- 7. Higher education should prepare not only employment seeker but employment provider also.
- 8. Higher education must inculcate social, moral, spiritual and human values.
- 9. Govt should allocate sufficient budget for higher education.
- 10. Teacher should make himself update and change as per modern concept of teaching
- 11. PPT system should be encouraged.
- 12. Pvt Teacher Education Institutions should be given some percentage of seats to fill from management quota.
- 13. Role of NGOs and Associations are necessary for all round development of higher education.
- 14. Govt should encourage these types of organization morally and financially.
